A SPECIAL DAY!

Twenty-six years ago this morning, July 24, 1990, a policeman knocked on my beach house door in North Myrtle Beach about 1 am. He said, "Your wife wants you to call her." I knew what that meant. I threw a few things in my car, told my fellow youth camp counselors I was leaving, and started driving across the state of South Carolina. Melissa had gone into labor and would be delivering twins in six hours – in Augusta.

Doctors had assured us that there would be no way Melissa would carry twins for forty-weeks. So I had felt comfortable agreeing to chaperone our church's youth the last week in July, since I assumed the babies would be three or four weeks old by then. But no, they waited until I was all the way across the state before they decided to emerge. We knew Melissa was having a Caesarean delivery; what we didn't know was that our doctor was facing a pressing family emergency, and had told Melissa that he would have to deliver the boys by 7 am. But I was speeding across the state anyway, along the way talking a state trooper into not giving me a ticket. I arrived at University Hospital in Augusta about 6:45 am. The receptionist yelled, 'Hurry! They're waiting for you!"

I quickly scrubbed, donned my surgical garb and entered the operating room. Melissa delivered William Stewart Kremer at 7 am, Mark Callison Kremer at 7:01. Then her blood pressure dropped precipitously in response to the anesthesia, and suddenly, the nurses handed me two babies and told me to leave. I spent the day with Melissa and my two new family members, then headed back across the state to resume my chaperoning duties. We've been juggling church and family responsibilities ever since.

We will start reassembling our Kremer family at the beach next weekend as we leave late next week for our vacation in L.A., lower Alabama, that is. You will be blessed by messages brought by two outstanding ministers over the next two Sundays, Dr. Craig McMahan from Mercer University, a frequent Vineville visitor, and Dr. Gary Parker, a noted Georgia writer and preacher. I'll be sharing more information about both ministers in the coming weeks.

Of course, this is a special Sunday also because it affords our youth a chance to repeat their presentation of our 125th Anniversary tableau. We offer you this morning a highly selective presentation of some of the people and events that have helped shape the personality and character of Vineville Baptist Church. I hope you will enjoy and respond to their presentation of worship in drama

This has been an extraordinarily full month. Twenty-five of our members gathered last Sunday afternoon to enjoy fellowship at the Sandy Beach Water Park. We expect a similarly-sized group to gather this afternoon at the Sky Zone. If you haven't yet let us know that you are coming, that's okay. Come on, anyway!
